


Trends in Dermatology Physicians, 2000-2020

SUPPLY AND DISTRIBUTION OF DERMATOLOGY PHYSICIANS

Dermatology Physician Distribution, 2020 Secondary Care Service Areas*




*State Service Delivery Regions; Effective July 1, 1998, the State Legislature voted to provide regional boundaries for the purpose of consistency in planning and service delivery from State Agencies.


- Ten of the twelve Secondary Care Service Areas are below the state rate for dermatology physicians per 100,000 people.
- Two of the same SCSAs reported in 2010 to be above the state rate (those around Atlanta and Augusta) remain above the state rate in 2020. During the same time period, Region 12 has fallen below the state rate since 2010.
- Georgia's rate of 3.1 dermatology physicians per 100,000 people is below the national rate of 3.8. Georgia's state rate has increased slightly since 2010, when the rate was 3.0.
- The number of dermatology physicians in Georgia has increased 48.7% from 244 in 2000 to 333 in 2020.
- The percentage of dermatology physicians who are board certified has increased from 85.0% in 2000 to 95.4% in 2020.

MSA vs. Non-MSA Distribution of Dermatology Physicians

The percentage of dermatology physicians practicing in Non-MSAs (Metropolitan Statistical Areas) has decreased slightly since 2010. GBHCW reported that 5.5% of dermatology physicians practiced in Non-MSAs in 2010, which compares to 5.4% in 2020.




DEMOGRAPHICS




The percentage of dermatology physicians who identify as female has increased over the past two decades, from 24.9% in 1996 to 50.0% in 2020.

The percentage of dermatology physicians who identify as non-white has increased since 1996. In particular, the percentage of dermatology physicians who identify as black has increased from 4.3% in 1996 to 16.0% in 2006 and 11.5% in 2020.

The percentage of dermatology physicians in Georgia who are 55 years or older has increased over the past two decades, from 25.2% in 1996 to 39.0% in 2020.





TRENDS IN THE NUMBER AND RATE OF DERMATOLOGY PHYSICIANS

The number of dermatology physicians practicing in Georgia has increased from 244 in 2000 to 333 in 2020. When compared to the changes in the population during the same years, the rate of dermatology physicians per 100,000 people has also increased slightly, from 2.9 in 2000 to 3.1 in 2020.
