
Introduction

The Georgia Board for Physician Workforce (GBPW) members and staff are pleased to present the Award Report for Scholarship Programs for the Fiscal Year 2018.

The Board voted in FY 2016 to begin phasing out this program and funnel all leftover funds into loan repayment programs. In FY 2018, the Board awarded **\$0** to zero recipients for the Scholarship Program, as there were no more medical students accepting the scholarship. However, there are 47 former scholarship recipients that are still under the program— two former recipients are still matriculating in medical schools, one former recipient who has deferred a spot in a graduate medical education program to complete another obligation, 20 former recipients are still training in graduate medical education programs/fellowships and 24 former recipients are now practicing in a rural county to fulfill their contractual obligations. Not included in these numbers is any former recipient currently in the repayment or default process.

The administrative costs to carry out these loan repayment programs is paid for with funds provided in the Georgia Board for Physician Workforce: Board Administration program of the Georgia Department of Community Health section of the state budget, while the awards were funded through the Georgia Board for Physician Workforce: Physicians for Rural Areas program of DCH. As noted above, the GBPW is currently phasing out the Scholarship Program and instead rolling leftover funds into the PRAA; all current recipients should complete the Scholarship Program and its service obligations around FY 2027.

Scholarship (Med. school)

The Georgia Board for Physician Workforce Scholarship is an annual award for Georgia students who have been accepted in an accredited four-year medical school in the U.S. leading to a Doctor of Medicine or Doctor of Osteopathy degree. This scholarship is designed to furnish \$20,000 in financial aid to deserving medical students who cannot afford the cost of medical school while also bringing needed medical attention to small rural communities in Georgia. Upon graduation from medical school and a residency program, recipients must be licensed to practice in Georgia and must contract to practice medicine in a community of 50,000 or less for one year after completing graduate medical education for each year of scholarship funding received. The scholarship is renewable for up to four years for a maximum of \$80,000. No medical students accepted the scholarship, as it is being phased out. However, the following individuals were awarded the scholarship in previous fiscal years but relinquished the award for this year, even though they are still enrolled in the medical school phase of the Scholarship program.

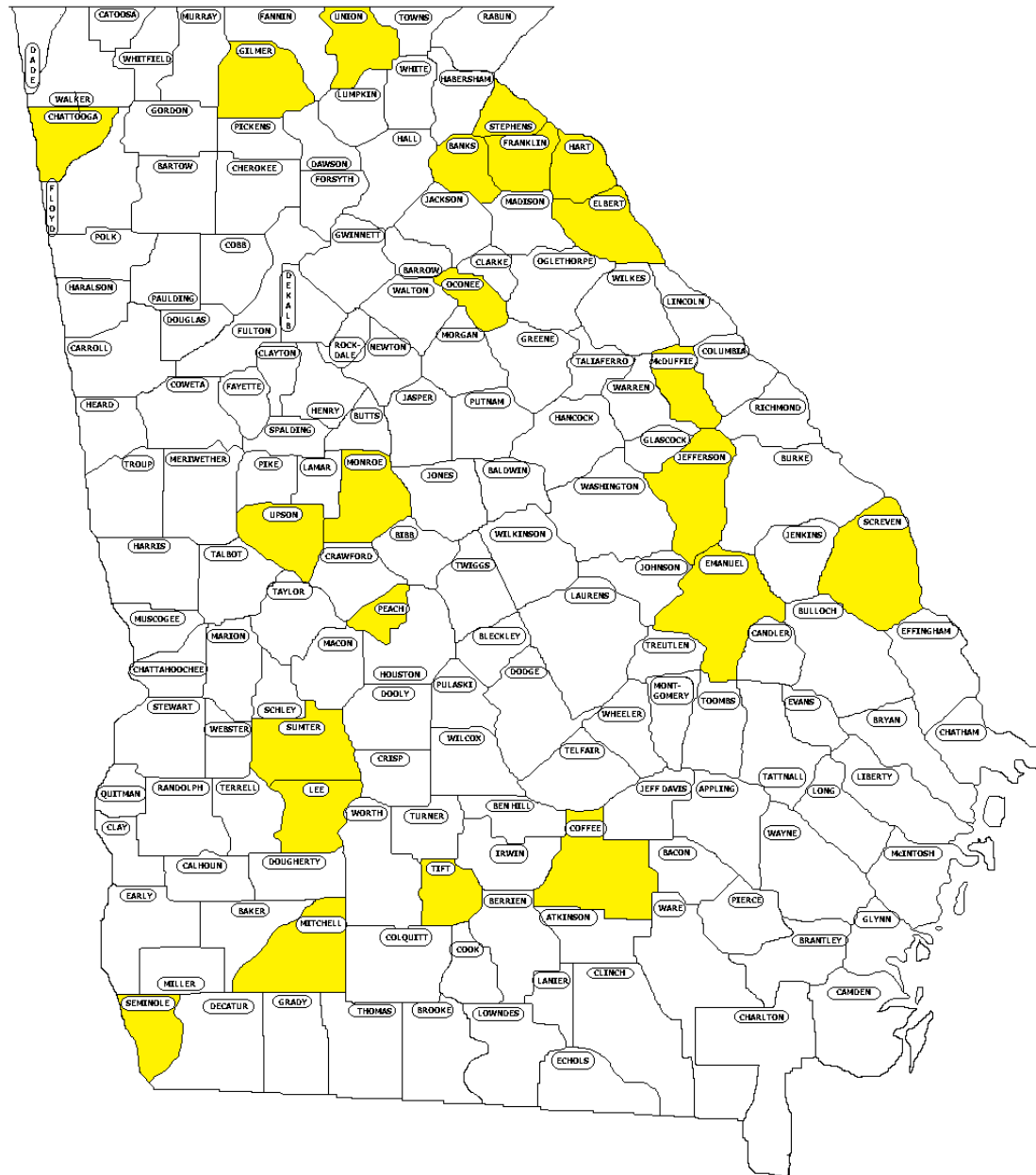
